Duet Reading

Objective: To increase fluent reading

Materials: Short texts that the student can read

with at least 95% accuracy.



Sequence:

First: Student reads the passage aloud. Teacher

provides immediate standard error corrections. ("That word is _____. What word?" The student repeats the word. Teacher says, "Yes. That word is ____." Student goes back to the

beginning of the sentence to begin again.)

Second: Teacher and student take turns reading EVERY OTHER

WORD. Teacher first this time. Teacher should read with excellent expression to avoid typewriter style output. Teacher should push the pace forward by reading each next word as soon as the student read the last word. Teacher provides standard error corrections immediately following any error. ("That word is _____. What word?" The student repeats the word. Teacher says, "Yes. That word is ____." Student goes back to the

beginning of the sentence to begin again.)

Third: Teacher and student take turns reading EVERY OTHER WORD.

Student first this time. Teacher continues to model excellent expression and to press the pace forward. Teacher provides standard error corrections immediately following any error. ("That word is _____. What word?" The student repeats the word. Teacher says, "Yes. That word is ____." Student goes

back to the beginning of the sentence to begin again.)

Fourth: Student reads the entire passage out loud alone.
